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# License Agreement Fees for the Center for Innovation and Economic Development (CIED)

## Fees

### **Incubator members affiliated between January 1, 2013 and June 30, 2015**

- \$1,320 annual license fee (payable in \$110 monthly installments)
- \$20/hour graphic design services

### **Incubator members affiliated on or after July 1, 2015**

- \$1,200 annual license fee (payable in \$100 monthly installments)
- \$120 per month per dedicated workstation
- \$100 per month for afterhours access
- \$20 per hour graphic design services
- \$100 one-time move in fee

## **Quarters for Conservation**

The Santa Fe College Teaching Zoo started a Quarters for Conservation (Q4C) program in 2016. The program is designed to increase our conservation budget and fulfill our commitment to conservation through the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) by raising money directly from guests. AZA zoos throughout the country have implemented Q4C, raising over \$1 million annually. The Q4C initiative is expanding to include a portion of each paid program offered on grounds at the Teaching Zoo.

The objectives for the Q4C are to raise significant funds for additional in-situ conservation projects; communicate how each zoo visit helps wildlife conservation; and encourage guests to take everyday conservation actions by showing how they are connected to wildlife survival.

# Santa Fe Fine Arts Performance Tickets

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In accordance with College Rule 5.9 Admission Fees for College Events the President's Cabinet is authorized to set fees for admittance to College events as appropriate and to designate appropriate College officials to issue complimentary tickets to events normally charging fees.

## Ticket Prices

Prices approved by the President's Cabinet for SF Fine Arts events produced in the Fine Arts Hall (FAH):

- Orchestra seats (404 seats) — \$15.00
- Balcony seats (203 seats) — \$15.00
- Seniors (60 & above) — \$ 9.00
- Children (12 & under) — \$ 9.00
- UF students w/ ID — \$ 9.00
- SF students, faculty, staff & retirees — FREE with SF ID
- Season Pass: buy tickets to 6 shows and get 1 free

The FAH ticket prices apply only to standard dance, music, and theatre events produced by the Fine Arts Department. For smaller events produced in the E-Building auditorium and Black Box theatre, the ticket charge is \$5.00 for everyone except for SF students, faculty, staff, and retirees, which the rate is free with a valid SF ID.

# SF Library Fees & Fines

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Borrowing privileges of Library books and/or materials is extended to all currently enrolled students, faculty, staff and retirees of Santa Fe with valid SF ID. Others may receive borrowing privileges as determined by the Library and/or special agreements. Library patrons are responsible for all items that appear on their account and any item not returned by the date/time due will be considered lost.

## Fees

Replacement cost (as determined by the Library) plus a \$10.00 processing fee is charged to patrons for each lost or damaged library book and/or material.

- Student records are flagged until all lost or damaged library books or material are returned in acceptable condition or replacement cost and processing fees are paid.
- A refund of replacement cost is made if a patron returns a paid for lost library book or material and the library has not replaced the item. The processing fee is not refunded.

The library does not charge fines for overdue library books or materials, except for eReaders, electronic devices and reserve materials. A \$10.00 fine per day up to seven (7) days will be assessed for these exception items.

- Such items are also subject to the replacement cost charge and \$10.00 processing fee after being overdue for seven (7) days.
- A \$10 processing fee will be charged to patrons who return an eReader that is not fully charged.

# Institute of Public Safety (IPS) Fees

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Certain fees apply to students of IPS law enforcement, corrections and emergency medical services programs. Applications to the College's Law Enforcement or Correctional Officer academies are submitted through the IPS Criminal Justice Selection Center. In accordance with Florida Statute 943.256, applicants to these academies must successfully complete the screening process established by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE), the Institute of Public Safety and the Criminal Justice Selection Center.

## Program Fees

### **Basic Recruit Class (BRC) for Law Enforcement/Correctional Officers: \$103 - 153**

The Basic Recruit Class prepares students to become an entry-level law enforcement officer or correctional officer in Florida. The Law Enforcement Officer BRC and the Correctional Officer BRC are separate programs.

- \$153 covers drug screening (\$35), fingerprinting (\$68), and Florida Basic Abilities Test (\$50).
- If the student has already passed the FBAT within the allowable time period, the fee is \$103 for drug screening and fingerprinting.

### **Basic Recruit Class (BRC) Rollover: \$103 - 153**

This program is designed for students who were previously enrolled in the BRC but could not complete the class, and who have since been readmitted.

- \$153 covers drug screening (\$35), fingerprinting (\$68), and the Florida Basic Abilities Test (\$50).
- If the student has already passed the FBAT within the allowable time period, the fee is \$103 for drug screening and fingerprinting.

### **Law Enforcement/Correctional Officer Crossover: \$0 - \$153**

This program is designed for Florida correctional officers who wish to earn law enforcement officer certification, and Florida law enforcement officers who wish to earn correctional officer certification.

- Potential fees include drug screening (\$35), fingerprinting (\$68), and the FBAT (\$50), depending on the circumstances concerning the applicant.
- There is no fee for the student if drug screening, fingerprinting, and FBAT are conducted and paid for by a sponsoring agency.

## **Equivalency of Training: \$50 - \$200**

This program is designed for persons who hold or held certification as a law enforcement officer in a state other than Florida, or with a federal or military agency, and who wish to be certified as a law enforcement officer in Florida. The program is also appropriate for previously-certified Florida officers whose certification has expired.

- A fee of \$200 applies to out-of-state and federal officers.
- A fee of \$50 applies to previously-certified Florida officers and to officers who served with military agencies.

## **Florida State Officer Certification Examination (SOCE): \$125**

All persons seeking certification as a law enforcement officer or correctional officer in Florida must pass the SOCE. This includes graduates of the Basic Recruit Class, the BRC Rollover, the Law Enforcement Officer / Correctional Officer Crossover classes, and the Equivalency of Training program. The \$125 fee applies to all test-takers.

## **Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Programs: \$68**

All applicants to the Emergency Medical Technician Program and Paramedic Program must be fingerprinted at the time of each application. A fee of \$68 for fingerprinting and database searches applies to all applicants to the EMS/Paramedic programs.

# Parking Fines

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In accordance with Board Rule 6.8, Motor Vehicle and Parking Control, the following schedule of fines and penalties for parking violations are in effect at all campuses and centers of the College.

## Fines

- Illegal parking in any form other than unauthorized parking in a space designated as accessible: each violation \$15
- Parking, stopping, or standing in a designated accessible parking space without proper permit: each offense \$100
- Towing: Any motor vehicle parked in areas where the College has posted tow-away zone signs may be towed at owner's expense

# Laboratory Fees

Florida Statutes 1009.22 (9) *Workforce development postsecondary student fees* and 1009.23 (12) *Community college student fees* allow the assessment of user fees. These fees shall not exceed the cost of the services provided and shall only be charged to persons receiving the service. At Santa Fe College, laboratory fees are assessed to students who are enrolled in classes that, because of their nature, require special funding not provided by regular tuition. Examples of items that would fall within the College’s definition of “unusual costs” include but are not limited to the following:

- Specialized instructional software
- Specialized instructional equipment
- Equipment and software maintenance agreements
- Substantial photocopying
- Tutors, student assistants, and lab assistants
- Pass-through costs from third parties
- Instructional videos or tapes
- Instructor certification programs and required continuing education
- Liability insurance
- Hazardous materials-related charges
- Differential faculty pay when market adjustment is necessary

Fees are reviewed in academic departments on a rolling three-year cycle with exceptions being made for fees associated with new courses or with substantial curriculum changes in existing courses. The college review cycle by academic department is as follows:

Fee requests or changes are initiated by the department’s chair or director and submitted to the Office of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs for review **at least 45 days** in advance of the college’s June Board of Trustees’ meeting. If approved by the provost, the lab fee form is forwarded to the Coordinator for Curriculum and Scheduling. The coordinator compiles the complete list of fees for the upcoming academic year and submits the list to the board at the June meeting for approval. All new and changed fees become effective with the fall term. These fees are brought to the board as a separate item each fiscal year in conjunction with preparation of the annual operating budget.

# Santa Fe Identification Card Fees

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Santa Fe issues identification cards to all SF students, faculty, staff and selected invited guests. The College values the service retirees provide to the College, and staff recommend that the College cover the cost of their first Santa Fe Retiree Identification Card.

## Fees

- **SF Student:** First card free, any replacement card(s) \$10
- **SF Faculty, Staff, & Retirees:** First card \$5 paid by Human Resources; any replacement card(s) \$10 paid by Faculty, Staff or Retiree
- **SF Affiliates & Special Programs:** First Card \$5 paid by Affiliate/Special Program sponsor or Affiliate/Special Program member; Any replacement card(s) within the term of the affiliation or special program \$10 paid by Affiliate/Special Program member

# Equipment Use or Damage Fee

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Various areas around the college loan individual equipment to students, student organizations, etc. The borrowers sign a form identifying the equipment checked out and agree if the item is returned damaged or is not returned that the borrower will be assessed the cost of repair or replacement.

## Fees

# Use of College Facilities/Equipment: Fine Arts Hall

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Pursuant to Agenda Item 6.6 on April 19, 2011, the president has established a schedule of fees specific to be charged for the use of facilities and equipment at the College's Fine Arts Hall. In addition, the president or his designee is authorized to modify or waive fees for specific events or users when college purposes are advanced. In the event a fee waiver or modification is granted, a statement of justification is filed with the approved application.

## Fees

All rates are effective January 1, 2017 and are subject to change without notice.

### Fine Arts Hall Rental

- Mainstage (Maximum Capacity 600): \$1,200 Standard Rate (1st 4 hours)
- Ground Floor Lobby (Max. Cap. 500 standing, 178 seated): \$720 Standard Rate (1st 4 hours)
- Multi-Purpose Studio (Max. Cap. 350 standing, 200 seated): \$720 Standard Rate (1st 4 hours)
- All Three Spaces \$2,400 Standard Rate (1st 4 hours)
- Additional time past 4 hours is invoiced at the applicable hourly rate.
- Installation or rehearsal is discounted 75%.
- Additional costs for equipment and labor will be determined based on the event requirements.
- If expected audience for Mainstage is below 300, rental of E Auditorium may be appropriate.

### Facility Reservation and Rental

Contact the Theatre Manager for facility rental. Dates for a given fiscal year, July 1 through June 30, can be held after March 1 of the prior fiscal year.

### Rental Agreements

All event documents must be signed and returned with deposit no later than 4 weeks prior to the event for Mainstage or All Three Spaces rental and 2 weeks prior to the event for Lobby or Multi-Purpose room rental, or College reserves the right to cancel the event. Renters must submit deposit, proof of insurance, proof of tax-exempt status, and all event documents.

### Deposit

A deposit is required at the time the event documents are signed and returned. The deposit is equal to the estimated cost of facility use. Rental deposits can be made with check, VISA, MasterCard, Discover Card or American Express. Cash payments cannot be accepted.

## **Insurance**

The Florida College System Risk Management Consortium (FCSRMC) provides liability coverage for non-college-sponsored individuals, groups, agencies and organizations renting College facilities that do not carry liability insurance. The fee for this coverage will be charged to the renter and is in addition to the rental fee. If private insurance is available, a certificate of liability insurance naming the College as an additional insured in the amount of \$1,000,000 is required. In the event the renter does not carry liability insurance, participation in the FCSRMC is mandatory.

## **Alcohol**

Generally, alcohol is not permitted on SF College premises. For specific events in the Fine Arts Hall permission may be requested to distribute alcoholic beverages. The President of the College is authorized to grant approval and may do so with certain restrictions and conditions. Any person or agency with authorization to distribute alcohol must provide the College with alcohol liability insurance coverage. The renter shall assume all responsibility for compliance with any applicable State of Florida Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco licensing requirements.

## **Catering**

While you are free to use the caterer of choice, beverages must be purchased in accordance with the College's agreement with Pepsi. If a caterer is providing the beverages, they must make purchases through the local Pepsi bottler using the College's contracted rates unless the caterer has its own existing agreement with Pepsi, in which case they can use their existing agreement. If you are providing beverages without using a caterer, then you must honor the College's agreement and make Pepsi purchases in accordance with the College's agreement. SF College reserves the right to review all publicity materials for events scheduled in the Fine Arts Hall before their release to the public.

## **Ground Floor Lobby & Multipurpose Room Events**

Labor and equipment costs per event will be determined by the College based on the needs and nature of the event.

## **Mainstage Performance Events**

Each audience event must employ, at minimum, a Technical Supervisor, and an Usher Supervisor. In addition, SF College Fine Arts Hall staff must operate specialized audio, video, lighting, and stage equipment and rigging. Additional labor and equipment will be determined by the SF College Theatre Manager and Technical Director, based on the needs and nature of the event. These charges are in addition to the rental fee.

## **Labor/Hourly information**

SF College-FAH supervisors will determine appropriate staffing for events, based in part on requirement outlined by any technical information given for the event. Additional staff that is required due to incomplete or unclear information will be determined by the Theatre Manager and the Technical Director. At no time will staffing levels be reduced to a level less than deemed safe by the Fine Arts Hall staff for the operation of the venue and its equipment. These charges are in addition to the rental fee.

- All ticketing is managed by the SF College Fine Arts Hall Box Office.
- Ticket prices will be inclusive of sales tax, if applicable.
- A Vendor Fee is assessed for every ticket sold.
- For ticket sales through the Website a per ticket fee (added to the event price) will be assessed based on the ticket price (including a merchant fee charge)
- For ticket sales at the SF Box Office a per ticket fee will be charged to the event based on the payment type
- No tickets will be issued until Event Documents are executed and deposit is received.

## **Additional Information**

- The collection of donations on site is not permitted.
- The sale of retail merchandise in the Fine Arts Hall is not permitted.
- The SF College Fine Arts Hall has no Standing Room sections.
- Renters must execute additional event documents if a change in event specification increases estimated costs more than 10% above the original estimate.
- Applicable sales tax rates apply to ALL services (rent, labor, etc.).

# Santa Fe College Harvey Sharron Bat Cave Field Laboratory

Primary use and control of the use shall reside with the Natural Sciences Department and its chairperson and/or designee(s). Permission for use may be granted to other departments of the College; to state and federal organizations; to educational institutions such as primary schools, secondary schools, colleges and universities, both private and public; to museums, geological and youth organizations; and to city, county, state and federal agencies, with restrictions and conditions. The College will consider requests for use of the facility from private organizations or other potential users only when presented with an appropriate rationale and may impose restrictions and conditions at its own discretion.

In addition, the president or his designee is authorized to modify or waive fees for specific events or users when college purposes are advanced. In the event a fee waiver or modification is granted, a statement of justification is filed with the approved application.
