
Both the Alachua County Library District (ACLD) and Santa Fe College (SFC) Library serve the same community and have similar aims of library service and education. Because of that relationship, I am pleased to share with you the services available to Santa Fe College students. The Alachua County Library District offers a wide range of library services, which are available to your students. Students may obtain an Alachua County Library District borrower's card free of charge at any Branch or Bookmobile stop.

Alachua County Library District's collection of over 700,000 items includes books, books-on-tape and CD, periodicals, music on tape and CD, movies on tape and DVD, electronic resources including subscription databases. We also have books in Braille, large print books, and magnifier reading systems to help our sight-impaired patrons. Assistive listening devices, sign-language interpreters on request for programs and closed-captioned videos are also available. Trained Librarians provide reference assistance to all library users. SFC students have access to our Interlibrary Loan services if they need materials we do not have in our collection.

The Alachua County Library District offers over 335 computers for Internet access to all library users. Access is offered equally to all users without charge. In addition, we have a complete on-line catalog and materials reserve service. These are available from any PC having Internet access allowing patrons to search for materials, put them on hold, renew materials, and update personal information. Alachua County Library District offers patrons on-line access to full-text articles from magazines, newspapers, journals, and encyclopedias; biographies; college catalogs and financial aid resources; business and company profiles; genealogy; location of print articles in our library; books and articles for interlibrary loan; and guidance on what book to read next.

Your students are most welcome to use the services of the Alachua County Library District. We are here to meet the information and reading needs of all the citizens in Alachua County.
