- MyPlan Online
 - An excellent program for assisting you in making career decisions and academic and career planning
 - Offers four assessments: Personality, Interests, Skills, and Values
 - Access through your eSantaFe account, under the "Career Planning" tab
- Guide for Occupational Exploration Career Interest Inventory Online
 - Asks about your activities of interest, compares the responses to occupational categories used by the US Department of Labor, and suggests which fields might be most worthy of exploration
- Career Coach
 - Helps you connect your program of study to a good career by providing the most current local data on wages, employment, job postings, and associated education and training

- **Career Pathfinder Workshops**

- Offered frequently during student intake times and throughout each semester

- **SLS 1301, Life and Career Development**

- A three (3) credit hour course designed to facilitate the career decision-making process and equip students with the necessary job search skills in the 21st century
- Students engage in discussions, activities and take assessments that explore their personalities, interests, abilities and values in order to develop their self-awareness and make informed career decisions

General Help:

- **Academic Advisement Center:**
 - An Academic Advisor has been assigned specifically to you to help you stay on course and complete your program of study. Use the Degree Audit Tab in eSanta Fe to set up an appointment with your advisor
- **Counseling Center**
 - Counselors are available to help you identify and overcome obstacles that you may be facing as you work towards your goals, call 352-395-5508 to schedule an appointment or drop in to R-227 (NW Campus) between 8:00am and 4:00pm M-F
- **College Success (SLS 1101)**
 - A three (3) credit hour course that will equip you with proven strategies on how to be successful
 - It offers strategies on preparing for exams, outlining notes, managing time, taking tests, thinking critically, using the computer, and communicating proficiently
- **SmartThinking**
 - Through your eSantaFe account, click on *Study Tools* to find the SmartThinking link, and you are clicks away from free online tutoring with a real live tutor, 24/7
- **Your Professors' Office Hours**
 - Your professors offer times for you to discuss your progress in the course as well as strategies to succeed
- **Disability Resource Center (DRC)**
 - Serves self-identifying students with disabilities who enroll at SF or attend one of the college's programs

Math Help

- **G-14 (The Math Lab)** - Tutoring is offered for students in any math class, from Pre-Algebra to Differential Equations, weekdays. From the SF Index, pick "Math Lab" to see times.
- **P-220 (The Math Studio)** - The Studio specializes in tutoring for MAT1033 (Intermediate Algebra) and MAC1105 (College Algebra), weekdays (late every day but Friday) and Sundays.
- **M-131 (The Math Quad)** - Tutoring for Developmental Education Math is offered Monday through Thursday late afternoons/evenings and Fridays.
- **L-54 (Student Support Services)** - Scheduled tutoring for students who qualify
- **S-112 (Office of Diversity)** - Tutoring is offered by appointment for students who qualify
- **Blount Center** - Tutoring for all math courses weekdays in DA-131 (closes early on Fridays)
- **Watson Center** - Tutoring for MAC1105 and MAT1033 in KA-102 or the uphill lobby every day
- **Davis Center** - Tutoring is offered Monday and Wednesday afternoons.
